It is envisioned that the team would remain on site for up to 7 days to help the community process their emotions and provide short-term case management, referral, and linkage. Additionally, the MHRSB will develop a treatment locator app. This intuitive application will include all OhioMHAS-certified entities in Lucas County and support the Rapid Response Team and community members' ability to locate desired behavioral health services rapidly.
