

#### **Protective Factors**

Protective factors are conditions or attributes in individuals, families, and communities that promote the health and well-being of children and families.

- Help ensure that children and youth function well at home, in school, and in the community.
- Serve as safeguards and support to children.
- Help to build coping strategies under stress.





# **Evaluation Outcome**

- 1616 Youth Surveys were collected.
- 86% of youth met a prosocial peer.
- 88% of youth learned from their program.
- 92% of youth said they would return to their program.
- 93% of youth enjoyed their program.
- 96% of youth met a caring adult.


