

Specialty Services



- ReadyCare
 - Tuesday and Thursday, 10am-2pm at 1832 Adams St. Toledo, OH
 - Walk-in services for immediate linkage to assessment, therapeutic behavioral health services and medication management evaluation
- Dialectical Behavior Therapy
 - Individual, Group and Multi-Family Group treatment for youth (ages 12-18) and adults
 - Comprehensive and fidelity treatment
- Double Arc Center for FASD
 - Diagnosis, treatment and consultation for Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD)
 - 1 of 3 diagnostic clinics in Ohio
- Project Direct Link
 - Provided to individuals incarcerated in Lucas County Corrections Center and Correctional Treatment Facility.
 - Services include assessment, connection to treatment services and Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) for opioid use before release from incarceration.

- Expressive Arts
 - The use of movement, music, performance, image making, creative writing, play and imagination in the service of healing mind and body.
 - Incorporates evidencedbased psychotherapy theory with creative expression.
 - Groups Offered*

Renewal House East



- Opened in 2015
- Ohio Recovery Housing Certified- Level 2 (Monitored)
 - Managed environment
 - House Rules
- Provides housing for up to 10 adult males.
- The length of stay is resident-driven but the average stay is around 120 days.
- Each resident receives individualized, person-driven recovery plans. These plans include linkage to programs for life skills development.

Clients Served



- 35 clients served in 2024
- At move-in
 - 31 had no income- 89%
 - 22 had legal involvement- 63%

Measurement Based Care



- Measurement-based care is a clinical approach that utilizes patient-reported data, such as symptom severity or progress, to inform treatment decisions and monitor treatment effectiveness
- OhioGuidestone utilizes various measurement tools to determine outcomes for the client we serve.
- Renewal House East utilizes client-reported Ohio Recovery Housing surveys for data specific to recovery housing.

The Need for Recovery Supports



- Lucas County has a drug overdose death rate at 55.3 deaths per 100,000 population in 2023.
 - Source: Ohio Department of Health- Ohio Unintentional Drug Overdose Deaths Report
- Toledo has 2.3% of the state's entire population but had nearly 5% of the state's overdose deaths in 2020.
 - Source: Drug Enforcement Agency
- Recovery housing is associated with a variety of positive outcomes for residents including decreased substance use, reduced likelihood of return to use, lower rates of incarceration, higher income, increased employment, and improved family relationships
 - Source: SAMSHA
- Approximately 50% of individuals in Recovery Housing have no income at all.
 - Source: Ohio Recovery Housing

The Recovery Journey



- Residents often need assistance with:
 - Scheduling and attending criminal justice appointments such as meeting with probation and court
 - Going to job interviews
 - Transportation to work until they receive their first few paychecks
 - Linkage to medical care
 - Linkage to sober support networks
 - Transportation to treatment services

OneOhio Award



Rent and Transportation Assistance for Lucas County Renewal House East Residents

- Rent
 - OhioGuidestone offers a 60-day rent scholarship program to individuals entering recovery housing
 - This scholarship results in a loss for the agency

Transportation

- OhioGuidestone offers transportation assistance to our services.
- Transportation assistance can also be offered at times by house staff but is limited due to staffing and amount of transportation assistance needed

How this helps



- OneOhio funding will provide support to residents for up to 36 months
- Due to having this support, residents will have time to focus on their recovery before focusing on obtaining income to pay for basic needs of housing and transportation.
- This support allows residents to build their recovery capital, obtain income and learn skills to budget to meet their needs unassisted
