

Lucas County EMS (LCEMS) Current System

- Implemented in early 1990's with the fall of REMSNO
- Funded by Lucas County sale and use tax of 7.75% as of 2022
- 11 Life Squads with two paramedics each stationed throughout the county
- Stipend paid to each jurisdiction per Life Squad
- 2023 all Life Squads responded to 26,772 incidents
- Collects ALS billing revenue



LCEMS Currently Provides

- ALS Medical Director
- Paramedic Continuing Education (CE) for all Lucas County Paramedics
- ALS vehicles and maintenance
- ALS supplies & equipment





Pitfalls of current system

- LCEMS ALS Medical Director and TFRD BLS Medical Director can cause confusion and conflict
- Paramedic CE program is mostly online
- LCEMS is governed by a policy board that does not agree on issues & changes due to varying staffing, needs, and resources
- TFRD has no operational control over when & where the life squads respond
