1. Please provide a brief description of the Project

The Old Orchard Neighborhoods Association (OONA) has put considerable effort in enhancing the neighborhood. Countless hours have been spent over the past several years in planning, designing and meeting with neighborhood constituents in moving this vision forward.

In partnership with the University of Toledo, we would like to enhance the beauty and create a better "sense of place" for Goddard Field. Owned by the University of Toledo, the open space has served as a gathering space for years. The deteriorating sidewalks are creating a safety hazard and a significant number of the boulevard trees within the right-of-way need replacement. We would also like to grade the field and construct gateway pillars similar to those used by the University to designate the University and Old Orchard. These additions will create better cohesion with the nicely landscaped front yard of the University's main campus.

The goals and objectives:

- To preserve the tree scape of Old Orchard and reverse the negative impact that years of tree removal without replacement has caused. Old Orchard is proud of its large population of old growth trees. Ongoing replacement is needed to prevent a noticeable depopulation of trees that can devalue properties.
- Improve pedestrian safety by replacing sidewalks.
- Promote identity through the addition of gateway columns.
- Continue the positive community building activities that utilize these green spaces (neighborhood social gatherings that utilize Goddard Field)

Benefiting Population:

Old Orchard residents, campus attendees, and the general Toledo population as a whole who will all be exposed to these improvements.

Open Field at Bancroft, Drummond & Goddard:

- No Federal funding has been allocated.
- The OONA board has met numerous times over the past 4 years with key University of Toledo contacts (Jason Toth, Daniel Klett, Bob Waddle, Nicole Baden) to present ideas and discuss project viability. A great relationship has been established. As a result, the removal and burial of utilities lines on the property, resulting in added safety for those using the field.
- The OONA board intends to foster this relationship with the University to continue enhancing this area.

- In 2022, OONA successfully held a celebration of the neighborhood's 100th Birthday. This casual outdoor event featured, music, food trucks and activities for kids and was attended by nearly 250 residents. It was funded by local business sponsors to keep the event free for neighbors. This event will continue in 2023 under the new name "Gather on Goddard".
