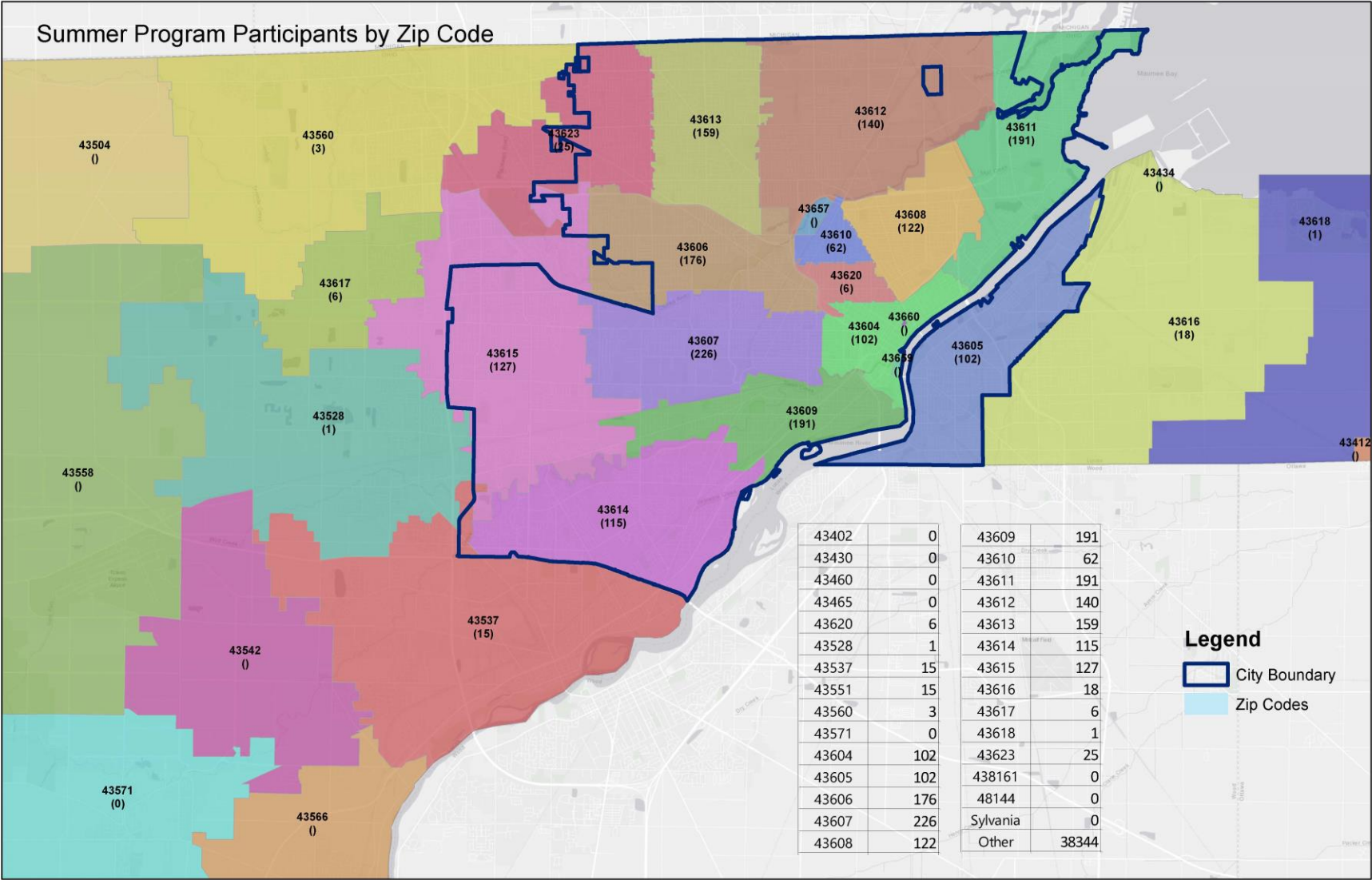

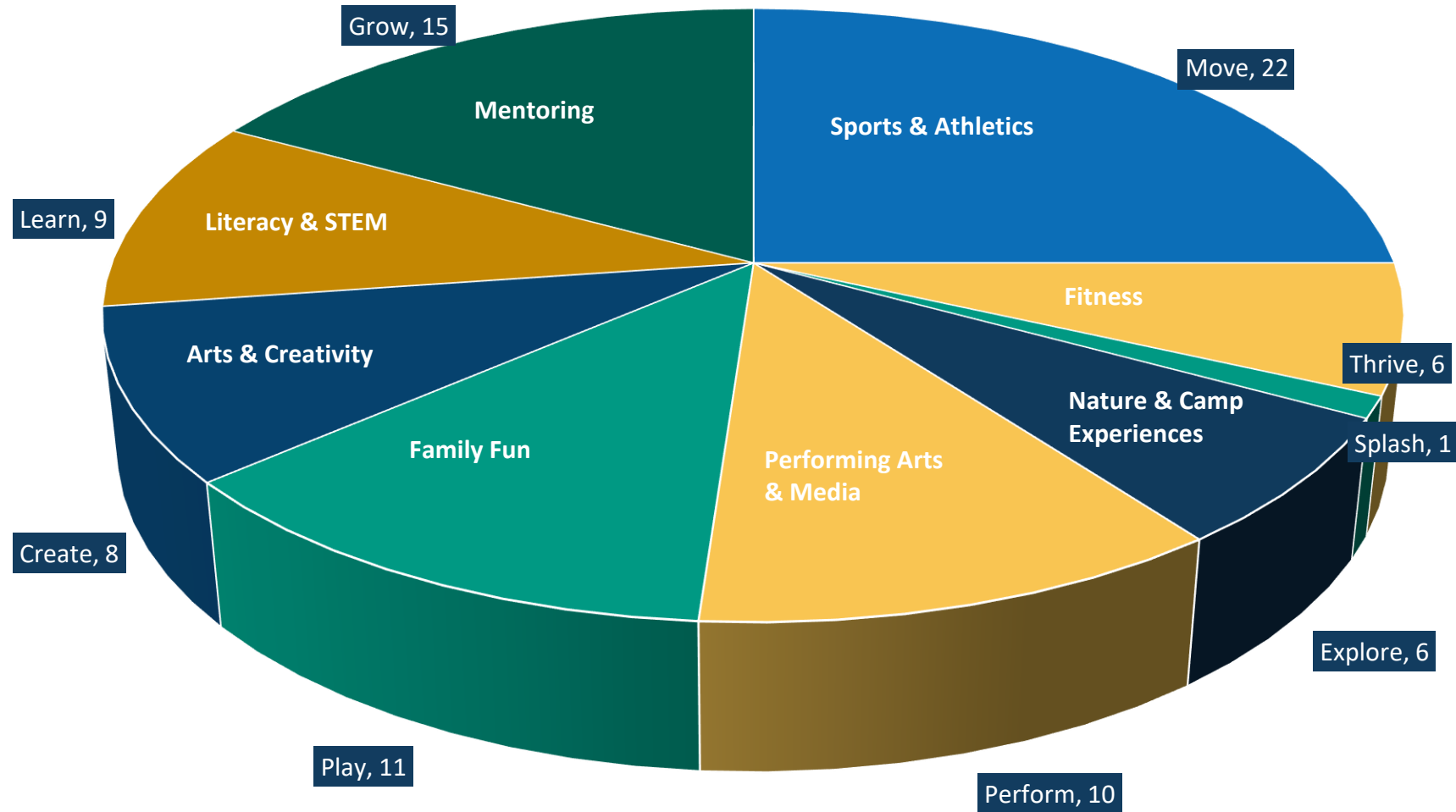

Protective Factors

Conditions or attributes in individuals, families, and communities that promote health and well-being of children and families.

- Help ensure that children and youth function well at home, in school, and in the community.
- Serve as safeguards and support to children
- Help to build coping strategies under stress



Evaluation Outcome

- 446 Youth Surveys collected.
- 82% met a friend.
- 87% learned from their program.
- 90% said they would return to their program.
- 96% enjoyed their program.
- 93% met a caring adult.
