The Beverly Roundabout Gateway Project aims to enhance one of the City's primary gateways from Maumee by introducing a custom "TOL" sculpture surrounded by lighting and landscaping at the heart of the roundabout.

This project goes beyond mere urban beautification; it is a deliberate effort to elevate the entrance to our City, extending a warm invitation to both residents and visitors of the numerous locally owned small businesses in the neighborhood such as Earnest Brew Works, Healthy Pharmacy, Plate 21, Printed on a Lark, and Smokin' Olive Deli. In contrast to the current state of the roundabout, plagued by an overgrowth of weeds, this initiative aspires to become a symbol of pride for the neighborhood and a catalyst for future investment in the area.

The Project is located at the intersection of Byrne Rd. Devonshire Rd. and S. Detroit Avenue.

In 2019, the signalized intersection was reconstructed with the current roundabout. There are no other city of state plans for improvements to the project area.
