






Children Served: 38,793 Youth

Protective factors are conditions or attributes in individuals, families, and communities that promote the health and well-being of children and families.


- Help ensure that children and youth function well at home, in school, and in the community.
- Serve as safeguards and support to children.
- Help to build coping strategies under stress.





Evaluation Outcome

- 1749 Youth Surveys were collected.
- 85% of youth met a prosocial peer.
- 87% of youth learned from their program.
- 90% of youth said they would return to their program.
- 92% of youth enjoyed their program.
- 93% of youth met a caring adult.






Children Served: 43,933 Youth
