St. Anthony's Church Revitalization

Director Fausnaugh gave an overview of the reasoning the reallocation of the ARPA \$\$'s for St. Anthony Church. A summary of the grant for Savage Park was discussed.

LC Treasurer Lindsay Webb gave an overview of why St. Anthony Church needs to saved and renovated. We are asking the COT for 1/6th of the total investment. County Commissioners will match the COT's investment.

D. Mann (LCLandbank): The church was built in 1894. Closed in 2005. The LB invested in the steeple. Recreation, Health, Youth programs and sustainability (from the neighborhood) were main issues to address. The building was built with no bathrooms. The total investment will be 6mil. We hope to finalize the budget this year. Beginning in May construction should begin, to open in summer of 2026.

A letter of commitment from the County Commissioners is requested.

A "sustainability plan" or lack thereof, was brought up. AARPA program funding will not be affected.

The COT will own the building at the end of the process.

A community partner will need to be engaged long term to manage operations of the building.

The residents in the Junction neighborhood have expressed they want a year-round community center.
