







- Pursue a broader range of funding sources while strengthening ongoing discretionary grant and earmark efforts
- Align City lobbying efforts with a broader regional federal advocacy strategy

Proposed Budget: \$77,000

Key Services

- Coordinate targeted meetings with key Administration and agency officials, legislators and staff, and relevant Congressional committees to advance City federal priorities
- Monitor annual appropriations and budget process and advise City on effective advocacy measures
- Track, analyze, and support advocacy on legislation impacting federal programs important to City
- Support and monitor grant applications and funding requests through consistent communication with agencies
- Coordinate regional advocacy trip to Washington, D.C. in partnership with other local agencies

Costs

12-month professional services contract: \$72,000

Regional fly-in coordination: \$5,000
