Body:

SUMMARY & BACKGROUND:

This Ordinance authorizes the appropriation and expenditure of \$300,000 from the proposed 2024 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) budget for traffic signal and signs upgrades. The City of Toledo is required by federal mandate to meet minimum traffic signal and sign requirements. These funds will allow the Division of Traffic Management to purchase materials to replace existing non-compliant signals and signs and related equipment that have reached their useful life throughout the City.

Body: SUMMARY & BACKGROUND:

In conjunction with the City of Toledo's acquisition of federal and state funding sources for infrastructure improvements, the city also works with and through TMACOG. The city's 2024 transportation assessment fee to TMACOG for their services is \$53,600. Funds have been budgeted and are available in the 2024 Division of Engineering and Construction Management's operating budget to provide for this payment.

The Stormwater Coalition is made up of governments, universities, and non-government groups that contribute annual membership dues to TMACOG. The 2024 Mass Media Campaign works to educate the public, provide opportunities for public involvement, and promote sound policies and practices to manage storm water runoff in our communities to help preserve Lake Erie. Funds for these dues and media campaign total \$28,031 and have been budgeted and are available in the approved 2024 Division of Environmental Services' operating budget to provide for this payment.

Lastly, this ordinance authorizes payment of the city's 2024 general purpose government membership fee from the General Fund in the amount of \$74,033. Funds have been budgeted and are available in the 2024 General/Non-Departmental operating budget to provide for this payment.

Body: SUMMARY & BACKGROUND:

This Ordinance authorizes the appropriation and expenditure of funds from the Capital Improvement (CIP) Fund for Gas Collection and Control System (GCCS) improvements and other necessary landfill development and construction activities at the Hoffman Road Landfill (landfill). These activities are needed to ensure compliance with relevant landfill permits, enhance effective operation and to comply with applicable regulations under Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) 3745-27 and relevant federal regulations. Furthermore, these activities support the city's sustainability goals by reducing the emissions of Greenhouse gases to the environment.

The 2024 landfill CIP program a combination of permitting, engineering and construction activities are needed. These include, but may not be limited to: 1) environmental consulting and engineering, 2) Construction Quality Assurance (CQA) and reporting, 3) upgrading the GCCS to replace wells and aging components 4) Replace components of the leachate management system, including a wet well, pumps, panels, piping and flow metering equipment,5) landfill surface grading, soil cover and seeding, 6) installing semi-permanent & permanent stormwater management features, 7) portable and permanent litter control measures, and 8) infrastructure improvements including roadways and ditches.

Body: SUMMARY & BACKGROUND:

Previous Ordinances 364-20 and 250-22 authorized DPU to enter into a contract with Deloitte for the implementation of the S4HANA billing system. In order to successfully migrate to the new billing system, it has been determined that there is a need to implement OnBase for the S4HANA environment. Deloitte is uniquely qualified to complete the implementation of this software as they are currently working on the implementation of the S4HANA billing system. A supplemental agreement to amend the scope of services and provide funding for the additional work would be executed in order to add this implementation to the existing contract. During the implementation of the S4HANA billing upgrade, it has also been determined that DPU has a need to obtain cloud hosting services for the legacy ECC6 environment, FTP Servers and SMTP mail servers. These environments would be contained in the AWS cloud with managed services being provided by Deloitte. Deloitte is uniquely qualified to host these environments as they are the existing Application Maintenance Services provider under an existing contract with the City. A new contract or a supplemental agreement to amend the scope of services and provide funding for the additional work would be executed in order to add the hosting services to the existing contract will be executed. By contracting with Deloitte, the city will have one provider for managed services for the DPU S4HANA billing environment.

This Ordinance authorizes DPU to amend their existing contract or establish a new contract with Deloitte for the implementation of the OnBase solution and establish hosting services as needed for the S4HANA billing project.

The components and services will be procured through the through the Ohio Department of Administrative Services or other cooperative purchasing program. This Ordinance authorizes the appropriation and expenditure of \$67,000 in the Sewer Replacement Fund and \$48,000 in the Water Replacement Fund and further authorizes the expenditure of \$635,000 from the Capital Improvement Fund.

Body: The City of Toledo has been awarded \$180.9 million through the American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA"). One of the four statutory eligible uses for these funds is for the provision of government services under the revenue replacement eligible use category.

This Ordinance authorizes the appropriation of \$17,901,842 million in funds in 2024. These funds will be used to cover public safety wages and fringes, which will be reclassified from the General Fund to the Local Fiscal Recovery Fund.
