<u>O-122-24</u>	Amending Toledo Municipal Code Chapter 2101 to change the salary structure for executive exempt positions; and declaring an emergency.
<u>Body:</u>	SUMMARY & BACKGROUND: Toledo Municipal Code Chapter 2101 governs the terms and conditions of employment for the City's Classified Exempt and Executive Exempt employees. This Ordinance repeals and replaces relevant sections of that chapter that references the E-5 salary group.
	This Ordinance streamlines and simplifies the compensation structure for all Executive Exempt positions by eliminating the E-5 salary group, and expanding the pay range for the E-4 group to include the former E-5 salary range. This change will provide greater flexibility in assigning a pay rate to a particular executive-level employee. Additionally, this change will reflect current market considerations for these critical positions. Moreover, this change will further assist in the effort to recruit and retain exceptional executive candidates. <u>Legislative History</u>

### **Body:** SUMMARY & BACKGROUND:

In 2023, the Toledo Municipal Court Clerk's Office processed 50,592 cases. Each case is assigned an individual file folder for all documents associated with that case. File folders are necessary for efficient recordkeeping and case processing. The Clerk of Toledo Municipal Court solicited bids for the bulk printing of Case File Folders and Case File Inserts. The bid from FriendsOffice, LLC met the Clerk's specifications and was selected. The total bid price was \$103,172.50.
