

retention and growth, and are drivers of strong economic development in the city. The city must prioritize these activities and develop a sustainable system of maintenance and support. Additionally, Mayor Kapszukiewicz formed the Recreation Task Force upon entering office in 2018. After months of study, a report was presented to the Mayor and Council that made recommendations as to recreation programming, maintenance of parks and facilities and funding. This legislation creates a system where parks and recreation once again become a priority for the city. Additionally, the elimination of the Youth Commission in 2018 created a void with respect to youth services and programming. This legislation also prioritizes this by creating a division that will be responsible for creating a system of support for developing and enriching the lives of young people. Finally, people need to have compelling reasons to choose Toledo as the place they want to live, work and raise a family. Employment opportunities are inextricably tied to education and training. Having an excellent school system is one incentive. The Division of Educational Engagement is created to develop a comprehensive plan for collaboration with educational partners and city support of initiatives aimed at achieving educational excellence for the betterment of all of Toledo.

The following resolution is procedurally required to allow for the repair or construction of new sidewalks in conjunction with the annual sidewalk rehabilitation program. By attending to the rehabilitation of sidewalks, the City will be preserving and enhancing this important asset for the benefit of residents. The 2021 approved Capital Improvement (CIP) budget allocates \$1,000,000 for the City's portion of the total project cost to pay for sidewalks damaged or raised by City tree roots and the installation of pedestrian curb ramps. The assessed sidewalk budget allocates \$750,000 for the property owners' portion of the total project cost to be assessed to the property identified as needing repair. It is necessary to perform both City portion and property owner portion together in this program since the rehabilitation is completed in conjunction with one another. This resolution initiates the assessment process by providing notice to those property owners whose property is in need of sidewalk rehabilitation in accordance with the City's sidewalk policy. The locations targeted for this year's program are identified in Exhibit A.
