Employees who are employed as of the union ratification date, January 5, 2022, as well as those Fire Chiefs who worked in 2020 during the pandemic and retired in 2021, are entitled to the COVID premium payment. Finally, beginning in January 2022, members will receive an annual stipend, totaling \$1,000, for safety equipment, physical fitness, and to recognize the unique nature of their position. The Toledo Firefighters' Local 92, Toledo Police Patrolman's Association, and Toledo Police Command Officers' Association receive similar stipends for the same reasons.
