## **City Parks Revitalization Initiative Informational Bullets**

- In 2019 all of city leadership agreed that City Parks infrastructure had long been neglected and supported a 5-year plan for revitalization of basic park infrastructure.
- With two years of work accomplished (having lost one year of financial support at the beginning of the pandemic), 2022 funding represents year three of implementation of the original plan.
- 2022 CIP funds will continue with repaving park roads, paths and parking lots, the replacement and addition of picnic tables, park benches and grills, park signage replacement, and additional infrastructure upgrades as needed.
- Exact quantities of each park improvement item to be purchased this year are difficult to predict due to a fairly volatile supply chain and inflationary price increases.
- 96 benches, 176 picnic tables, and 132 park ID signs have been installed to-date.
