We are excited to showcase the survey's findings and help you better understand the state of Toledo's neighborhoods in 2021.

















Street Tree Canopy Goal

- 76% of the neighborhood has sidewalks, 79% of them are functional.
- The median residential property value is **\$55,300**.
- Property taxes are current for **81%** of the neighborhood.
- 5,078 vacant lots and 1,907 vacant structures are tax delinquent.
- The Land Bank has improved **8,353 parcels** in the city already.
