13 Mayor Appointed Members of the Community


- Previously the Board of Community Relations did similar work in Toledo
- Mayor Kapszukiewicz proposed the HRC to reduce violence, support tolerance building efforts, coordinate mediations, and support social justice initiatives in Toledo
- City Council approved the first members of the HRC in June 2018





The Human Relations Commission shall endeavor to support a safe, energetic, and livable city. The Commission will support residents working to overcome prejudice and build mutual respect.





Structure of the HRC









MAYOR'S OFFICE

Shall serve as a bridge for the Commission to the Administration of the Mayor's Office

- Is responsible for overseeing the budget and facilitating the approval of budget requests
- Shall assist with the creation of media campaigns
- Working with the Marketing and Communications Department
- Shall assist with the logistics of events

Create and facilitate meetings on behalf of Commission members as needed

Attend monthly Executive Committee meetings, monthly Full Commission meetings, and weekly Executive Committee touch base meetings

Attends Committee Meetings as needed or requested

Can aid in advocacy, if needed



EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE (LIAISONS)

Chair: Will conduct Commission meetings, budget oversight, spending, set agendas, direct the Executive Committee, and serve as Commission Spokesperson

1st **Vice Chair:** Will work in conjunction with the chair on planning and agendas, will sit for the Chair as needed, will be responsible to direct and manage the work of the Commission Committees

2nd Vice Chair: Will work in conjunction with the chair, will step in for 1st Vice Chair when needed, will be responsible for educating the Commission on issues the Commission can address, will be responsible for bringing in a speaker to present information to the Commission at the monthly meetings

Secretary: Will work in conjunction with the Executive Committee on agendas, will communicate reminders of meeting dates and times as well as handle correspondence and help with marketing and communications

Mediation Chair: Will serve on the Executive Committee to manage the mediation process

City Council assigns an ex-officio member to serve as a connection to City Council and aid in function of the HRC – Dr. Tiffany Whitman

One member of Exec will represent the HRC on:

- Welcome TLC/Sister Cities
- CEDAW
- Getting Healthy Zone



LIAISONS

Executive Members shall serve as liaisons to Committees in an advisory capacity

 Attend committee monthly meetings and relay information/questions to the Executive Committee during weekly touch base meetings

Meeting requirements:

- Monthly Executive Committee Meetings 2nd Monday of every month
- Monthly Commission Meetings 3rd Monday of every month
- Monthly Committee Meetings varies by committee, subject to change
- Weekly Executive Committee Touch Bases Friday afternoon

2023 Goals

Goal 1: Establish a healthy committee with ten members attending 50% of the meetings and events.

 Committee should include a representative from Toledo Safety Forces, Save our Community, Toledo Public Schools and the faith community. **Goal 3:** Continue to work on the eSports pilot programs.

- Pilots will be launched Q1-3 within the Library system with a large tournament in Q4
- Build the eSports mentorship program with partner programs
- Collaborate with the YEE committee to ensure a larger reach

Goal 2: Collaborate with Save our Community for a 72-hour response to shootings

Goal 4: Partner with the other committees to implement violence stopping efforts into the HRC as a whole
