- COT Parks are in need of significant upgrades. The 2019 CIP spending plan complements the other work being funded by the Park Revitalization/Rebranding initiative, as well as projects utilizing District Improvement Funds.
- Specific spending plans outlined below cover a variety of parks across the city.
- In all cases, the PRF division is working closely with neighborhood stakeholders to incorporate the desires of the people using the parks.
