## 1. <u>Brief Description of the Project.</u>

Smith Park is a space in transition. With the opening of the new, world-class Mott Branch Library in June, the space continues to grow as a positive hub of activity for the immediate neighborhood and beyond. The current play-system is old, tired, and broken. In order to lift up the entire space and provide the children with an appropriate place to play, a new system is proposed.

The new play system is part of a larger project to lift up Smith Park and complement the new library with an appropriate park. \$50,000 in funding has already been secured: \$25,000 through the COT Parks Division's Capital Improvements Project budget, and a \$25,000 donation from the Toledo Lucas County Library. Additional donations are being sought from local business leaders to close the remaining gap of \$50,000, assuming the DIP funds are secured. The ongoing maintenance of the park and the playground system will be the responsibility of the COT Parks Division, in collaboration with neighborhood stakeholders.

The Toledo Community Coalition was formed in October 2011, a community issue concerning funding for Neighborhood Community centers located in the urban core of our City. Community leaders met with United Way and other funders to challenge this issue, and to try to bridge an understanding and assistance that children of minority, and underserved families should have the same opportunities to enhance their quality of life. The coalition has been successful in collaborating and planning with businesses, non profit organizations, elected officials, and community citizens to help bridge an understanding with civic engagement through forums called; Changing Minds& Changing Lives. These forums where held on the topics of Racial Bias, Profiling, Housing, Health, and Economic Development. We have created a followup program to these forums called Dialogue to Change sessions to talk about issues and build relationships with other cultures. The mission of Toledo Community Coalition to promote collaboration among groups and organizations dedicated to improvement and empowerment for African-American and other underserved populations of Toledo. We strive to eliminate racism in all forms and to educate, empower, and act as a support base.
