STAFF ANALYSIS

The applicant is requesting a Special Use Permit for a new school at 4747 Heatherdowns Boulevard. The ±11.7-acre site is zoned RS12 Single-Dwelling Residential and occupied by an existing building, roughly 27,000 square feet. In recent years the building was occupied by a School, but previously operated as an assembly hall. Surrounding land uses include open green space and a funeral home to the north across Heatherdowns Boulevard, the Stranahan Theater to the east, the Ohio Turnpike to the south, and single family homes to the west across Cass Road.

STAFF ANALYSIS (cont'd)

The applicant, STAR Academy of Toledo, intends to operate a public community school out of the existing building on site. The school will teach grades K-8 with an enrollment of 200 kids at full capacity. The school will also employ 21 employees while operating 170 school days a year from 8:00AM-4:00PM, with tutoring until 6:00PM. A Special Use Permit is required for all schools in the City of Toledo.

Parking and Circulation

As listed in TMC§1107.0304 *Parking, Loading, and Access – Schedule A*, an Elementary and Middle School is required to have one (1) parking space per faculty member plus (1) parking space per three (3) staff members plus one (1) parking space per fifty (50) students for drop-off and pick-up area. Additionally, one (1) bicycle space per three (3) students plus one (1) bicycle space per ten (10) parking space for faculty and staff. The site plan and letter of intent submitted indicates there will be seventeen (17) faculty members, four (4) staff members and 200 students. Calculations conclude that a total of twenty-three (23) parking spaces are required with one (1) van-accessible parking space for physically disabled persons.

The site plan submitted depicts a total of 159 parking spaces with six (6) spaces designated for persons with disabilities and fifty (50) bicycle spaces, the maximum required. While the available parking provided is in excess of the maximum allowable parking spaces, 150% of the minimum parking requirement, an alternative parking plan will not be required because the parking is existing on site. Additionally, a shared parking/cross-access agreement shall be established and maintained with the property to the north in order to access the facility from Cass Road and Heathedowns Boulevard. In the event the cross-access is altered in any way, a re-review of the Special Use Permit shall occur and listed as a condition of approval.

Per TMC§1107.1905 – *Appearance*, the materials used in the design of paving, lighting fixtures, retaining walls, fences, curbs and benches must be of good appearance, easily maintained, and indicative of their function. Additionally, as stated in TMC§1107.1909 – *Maintenance*, parking lots must be maintained in a safe operating condition so as not to create a hazard or nuisance. The applicant shall maintain the parking lot and driveway access from Cass Road in order to comply with the Design Standards of 1107.1900 and is listed as a condition of approval.

STAFF ANALYSIS (cont'd)

Landscaping

The site was developed before the 2004 zoning code and therefore not required to completely comply with the landscape standards of the 2004 code. However, TMC§1114.0500 Appearance Upgrade for Nonconforming Development, requires futures changes to bring a site closer into compliance with the 2004 code. A thirty-foot (30') frontage greenbelt is required along Cass Road and shall include at least one (1) tree for every thirty-foot (30') of lot frontage located outside the right-of-way. A total of twenty (20) trees shall be required along Cass Road. Foundation plantings shall be provided along each street facing building elevation and at all major entrances. Additionally, the terminal islands in the parking lot shall be landscaped and maintained in conformance with the Parking Lot Landscaping regulations of TMC§1108.0204.

The site plan submitted depicts a landscaping area thirty-foot (30') wide but does not depict any plantings in the greenbelt, terminal islands or around the foundation of the building. A Landscaping Plan shall be submitted depicting the frontage greenbelt, foundation plantings and landscaped terminal and listed as conditions of approval.

Toledo 20/20 Comprehensive Plan

The Toledo 20/20 Comprehensive Plan designates this property for Institutional Campus land uses. The Institutional Campus future land use designation is intended to accommodate large institutional uses in campus-like settings. Examples such as hospitals, schools and colleges are considered Institutional Campus land uses. The IC District is intended to promote and enhance the development and expansion of medical, educational and other institutional uses. The proposed school conforms to the future land use designation targeted in the 20/20 Comprehensive Plan.

Staff recommends approval of the Special Use Permit for this location because it is compatible with the established land uses along Heatherdowns Boulevard. Additionally, the site conforms to all applicable provisions of the Zoning Code. Finally, the proposed use meets the purpose of the Zoning Code as outlined in TMC§1101.0400.

PLAN COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION

The Toledo City Plan Commission recommends approval of SUP-4008-19, a Special Use Permit for a new school at 4747 Heatherdowns Boulevard, to Toledo City Council for the following three (3) reasons:

1. The proposed use meets the stated purpose of the Zoning Code (TMC§1111.0706(A) – *Review & Decision Making Criteria*).

2. The proposed use complies with all applicable provisions of the Zoning Code (TMC§1111.0706(B) – Review & Decision-Making Criteria); and

3. The request is compatible with adjacent uses in terms of scale, site design, and operating characteristics (hours of operation, traffic generation, lighting, noise, odor, dust, and other impacts associated with the use's operation) (TMC§1111.0706(C) – *Review & Decision-Making Criteria*).

The Toledo City Plan Commission further recommends approval of SUP-4008-19, a Special Use Permit for a new school at 4747 Heatherdowns Boulevard, to the Toledo City Council subject to the following **thirty-eight (38)** conditions:

- 2. All **proposed** sidewalk, drive approaches, curb, and pedestrian curb ramps within the public right-of-way shall be constructed in accordance with the City of Toledo Construction Standards, Specifications, Toledo Municipal Code, and Americans with Disabilities Act guidelines.
- 3. All commercial drive approaches (along with the sidewalk through the drive) shall be constructed with 8" thick concrete per City of Toledo Construction Standards and Specifications. No curb shall be permitted in the right-of-way along either side of a drive approach. No horizontal curb cutting will be permitted to create a curb drop and/or opening. Existing drive approaches, including the curb drop, that will no longer be utilized shall be removed and restored with curb to match the adjacent curb.
- 4. Required permits for all approved work in the public right-of-way shall be obtained, before work begins, from One Stop Shop, (419) 245-1220.

- 5. Water service is available subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Department of Public Utilities.
- 6. The existing building currently receives water service via the Stranahan Theatre's water service lines. If this arrangement is intended to continue, the applicant will be required to show proof they have permission from the owners of the Stranahan Theatre.
- 7. If new water service lines are intended to serve the existing building, plans shall be submitted to the Division of Engineering Services for review and approval. Plan for disconnection from the Stranahan Theatre's water services lines shall be submitted to the Division of Water Distribution for review and approval.
- 8. All commercial properties are required to have approved backflow protection devices installed on the domestic water service and fire protection lines. Installation of the devices must be verified by the Division of Water Distribution and all devices must be registered with www.BSIonlinetracking.com @ 800-414-4990. In the case of renovation, expansion or modification projects, all existing backflow devices must be verified and registered. Where devices are missing, they shall be added. Contact the Division of Water Distribution (419-245-1395) to verify the backflow prevention requirements for this site.
- 9. Contact the City of Toledo Fire Prevention Bureau (419-245-1263) to verify the fire protection requirements for this site.
- 10. Plan Commission submittal does not detail any revisions to the existing site that will require earth-disturbing activity of 2,500 or more square feet, nor are any changes shown to the existing storm sewer system. Therefore, it appears that there are no items requiring a stormwater plan review by Division of Engineering Services. However, if revisions are made to the site plan that will result in earth-disturbing activity of 2,500 or more square feet or cause changes to the existing storm sewer, a full site-plan review and approval will be required by the Division of Engineering Services, subject to the rules and regulations of the City of Toledo including stormwater detention and post-construction stormwater BMPs as specified in the City of Toledo Infrastructure Design and Construction Requirements, and the Ohio EPA NPDES General Stormwater Permit for Construction Activities.

- 11. Any person performing earth-distubring activities within the City of Toledo shall employ Construction Best Management Practices (BMPs) to provide sediment and erosion control during construction. Construction BMP's shall be designed and installed per the latest Ohio EPA General Stormwater NPDES Permit.
- 12. Sanitary sewer service for this development is available subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Department of Public Utilities.

Division of Environmental Services

- 13. Applicant shall maintain compliance with the City of Toledo's Stormwater regulations as specified in the Toledo Municipal Code.
- 14. Applicant shall maintain compliance with Ohio EPA's General Stormwater NPDES permit programs.
- 15. Any green infrastructure measures that can be included to minimize runoff and increase infiltration are highly advisable.
- 16. Applicant shall maintain compliance with the City of Toledo's stormwater regulations as specified in the Toledo Municipal Code. Special attention must be paid to all potential stormwater impacts from the modification, including but not limited to long-term operation and maintenance of both structural and non-structural Best Management Practices.
- 17. Any effort made to plant non-invasive trees, shrubs and perennials is highly encouraged. http://ohiodnr.gov/portals/0/pdfs/invasives/Alternatives_to_Ohio_Invasive_Plant_Species.pdf
- 18. Applicant shall maintain compliance with the City of Toledo and State of Ohio's Air Quality Regulations applicable in the Toledo Municipal Code and the Ohio Administrative Code including, but not limited to the Asbestos and the Anti-Noise Laws.

Fire Prevention

- 19. Annual Fire Safety inspection shall occur prior to the occupancy by the new tenant.
- 20. Facility identification is required. It shall be visible to approaching Fire Department vehicles.

Division of Transportation

- 21. All accessible parking spaces must be a minimum of 9'x18' with a 5' aisle for caraccessible spaces and 8' aisle for van-accessible spaces per TMC 1107.
- 22. Sidewalk required along Cass Road. Provide a walkway system from Cass Road to the school building per TMC 1107.
- 23. If not already established, cross access agreements shall be formalized with adjacent property owner to the North and the East.

Plan Commission

- 24. A revised site plan shall be submitted addressing the Division of Transportations conditions of approval.
- 25. All spaces reserved for the use by persons with physical disabilities shall adhere to the standards outlined in TMC§1107.1700; acceptable as depicted on site plan.
- 26. Bicycle parking slots shall be provided pursuant to Off-Street Parking Schedule "A" (TMC§1107.0300), which requires one (1) bicycle parking slot per ten (10) parking spaces; acceptable as depicted on site plan.
- 27. Dumpster location(s) shall be clearly defined, have a concrete pad and be surrounded by a solid wooden fence or a masonry screen enclosure with landscaping and shall not be located in any required setbacks or the public right-of-way as stated in TMC§1361.10(b)(10) of the Building Code (if applicable).
- 28. The materials used in the design of paving, lighting fixtures, retaining walls, fences, curbs and benches must be of good appearance, easily maintained, and indicative of their function as stated in TMC§1107.1905 *Appearance*.
- 29. Off-street parking and loading spaces, parking lots, maneuvering areas, aisles and driveways must be surfaced with concrete, bituminous asphalt, or other dust-free material other than gravel or loose fill, and be graded to drain all surface water towards the interior of the parking lot, or to a stormwater system subject to the regulations and approval of the Department of Public Utilities

- 30. Whenever a parking lot extends to a property line, sidewalk, planting strip, or building, a wheel stop device consisting of a concrete stop, a permanent concrete curb, an expanded sidewalk or other suitable restraint as approved by the Planning Director must be installed to prevent any part of a parked motor vehicle from extending beyond the property line, overhanging a pedestrian walkway or sidewalk, or damaging any structure or landscaping (TMC§1107.1907(A)).
- 31. Pursuant to TMC§1107.1909 *Maintenance*, parking lots must be maintained in a safe operating condition so as not to create a hazard or nuisance. All materials used in the construction of paving, lighting fixtures, retaining walls, fences, curbs and benches must be continuously maintained and kept free of debris and hazards.
- 32. No <u>new</u> free-standing signs greater than forty-two inches (42") from grade are permitted any proposed signage must meet the requirements of low-profile signs per Toledo Municipal Code Title Nine Sign Code.
- 33. A detailed site, lighting, fencing and four (4) copies of a landscaping plan (separate from building & site plans) shall be submitted to the Plan Director for review and approval. Such plan shall include:
 - a. A thirty-foot (30') greenbelt is required along the Cass Road frontage and shall include one (1) tree per every thirty-foot (30') of frontage; not acceptable as depicted on site plan. A total of twenty (20) trees shall be installed along Cass Road and shall be depicted on a completed landscaping plan.
 - b. Foundation plantings for the full street-facing building elevation; and landscape areas at major building entrances. Shall be depicted on a completed landscaping plan.
 - c. Landscaped terminal islands must be provided at the end of each parking. Shall be depicted on a completed landscaping plan.
 - d. Landscaped areas may not contain bare soil, aggregated stone or decorative rock. Any ground area must be covered with hardwood mulch, grass or other vegetative ground coverage.
 - e. The location, number, height, diameter and species of any materials to be planted and maintained, as well as the location and number of any existing trees to be retained, trees, shrubs, and landscape materials shall meet the standards included in TMC§1108.0400 Landscape Materials Standards;

- f. If site is ½ acre or larger, landscaped areas must be irrigated as necessary to maintain required plant materials in good and healthy condition. Irrigation plans must be submitted with development plans and must contain all construction details.
- g. The location, height and materials for any fencing to be installed and maintained; and
- h. The location and direction of any proposed lighting (lights are to be directed away from adjacent residential properties).
- 34. A Bond of Performance or suitable assurance acceptable to the Division of Inspection valid for a period of two (2) years shall be posted with the Commissioner of Inspection providing for the installation of required landscaping within one (1) year. Landscaping shall be installed and maintained indefinitely.
- 35. The Special Use Permit may be reviewed for compliance with the conditions of approval, negative secondary effects, and adherence to all requirements of the Toledo Municipal Code. If outstanding issues are found and not addressed the Special Use Permit may be considered for revocation.
- 36. Approval of the Special Use Permit will lapse after one (1) year if the criteria listed in TMC§1111.0707 have not been met.
- 37. Minor adjustments to the Site Plan that do not violate the above conditions, or the Toledo Municipal Code, may be reviewed and approved by the Director of the Toledo City Plan Commission.
- 38. No permits shall be issued until arrangements satisfactory to the Director of the City of Toledo Plan Commission have been made for compliance with the conditions as set forth above.



SUP-4008-19 ID 142







ZONING & LAND USE

Toledo Planning Commission;

In response to the notice of above public hearing. My name is Betty R. Mallory and I live and own the property at 2408 Heatherlake Place. I am not able to attend the above meeting.

My vote for the Special Use Permit for a new school at 4747 Heatherdowns Blvd. is **NO**!!! Here are just some of the reasons why this permit should NOT be granted.

When the Masons abandoned their building and grounds a few years back the property was sold to a company out of Ann Arbor, Mi. It has been grossly neglected as is often the case when owners are out of state, so it has been an eyesore to our neighborhood. That company put a Charter School in a part of the old damaged Masons building. The school was not an asset to the community with several gang related fights brought to the school causing more damage to the old building as well as much stress among this basically older, calmer, neighborhood. That charter school failed and since then the building and grounds have had no services providing upkeep in almost two years.

Now we learn that this property is in the hands of another company out of state – Virginia – so most probably will still be unattended and an eyesore. There will be bus delivery to and from which adds to the congestion on Cass and Heatherdowns Rds. Newcomber Funeral Home already causes many complete traffic stops on both those Rds. Very frustrating for most drivers.

I live in a private community called Heatherlake Commons and we feel very safe and quiet back in here. My concern is we homeowners in our HOA are responsible and have the liability for our pond/lake which attracts curious children who do not obey our posted rules of No Trespassing. I and most of our community do not want to have another school in that building which may **again** bring in families who are curious of our quiet residential areas and again will do drive throughs to check us out. This is a threat to our security. Thank you.

SUBJECT: Third Special Use Request

I have been the chief executive officer for the Stranahan Theater and Great Hall since May of 2014. Upon my arrival I was apprised of a charter school residing in one of the three buildings at the complex.

I looked into the history of the Masonic Complex, consisting of the Theater, Great Hall & Lodge, and discovered that this is a Special Use in a residentially zoned district. It was approved as a Masonic Campus, and viewed as a synergistic, commonly administered complex.

Prior to my entertainment venue management career I was a municipal planner and staff to the City of Moline, IL Plan Commission and City Council. In that 15 year career, I have written a number of Special Use analysis and reports.

Simply stated an institutional special use is just that, its purpose is to place certain campus-like uses within a religious, education, and assembly setting, whose administration is singular in focus.

In my professional opinion the charter school use, from 2012, should have never been granted because it does not fit the definition of a singular administered campus, which was basis for the original approval.

That Charter School went out of operation in 2016 for a variety of reasons, but most importantly it negatively impacted this community asset. We have previously provided the Planning Commission with documentation of the problems with the prior school, and we are providing that same information again now.

Then, in 2018 the absentee landlord had his son apply for another

Special Use permit as an Adult day Care. Despite our objections that too was approved, but the work required by this Commission and the City was never completed and the Adult Day Care Center never happened.

Just a few weeks ago we learned that yet another Special Use application has been made for another Charter School. We will be in attendance at the Plan commission meeting on the 13th of June. We will again object on the grounds that it in violation of the original approval.

In closing I want to go on the record with the following:

I have been fortunate in the last 25 years to have operated five different entertainment venues across this country. The impact each and every one of those venues has had, within those communities, in terms of the quality of life and the economic impact they produce, is irreplaceable.

We often forget that they are fragile in their operations and can only survive if they can sell tickets.

Our mission needs to be: that we do everything in our power to ensure that the Stranahan Theater and Great Hall is here, as an integral part of the fabric of our region, forever.

We have not, and do not, view a non-campus use as meeting the intent of our Special Use, and are therefore requesting that this application be denied. Thank you.

Dear Toledo City Plan Commission

I am the Executive Director of the Stranahan Theater and Great Hall. This letter is written with the full support and approval of the Stranahan Theater and Great Hall Board of Trustees.

It is our understanding that the building attached to the Great Hall/Theater complex is being considered for an adult daycare use.

I would like to go back to, in our opinion, the original intent in a granting this Special Use in a residentially zoned area. The proposal that was reviewed, and approved, was for a complex of three attached buildings, with common walls, and of important note, a commonality in, use, operating model, and business interest and joint operations. It was for all intent and purpose a campus that was knowingly created by granting approval.

When I arrived here in 2014, to take over the day to day operations of the Theater and Great Hall, there was a charter school in operation. In the mid to later part of 2015, we were approached by an employee of the school informing us that they had concerns because another employees, who was hired to be the custodian had established an apartment within the school building.

In early January of 2016 the Toledo Police Department was summoned late on the 17th because there was apparently a party going on inside the school that resulted in an altercation and assaults to the degree that there were numerous injuries. There are Police reports on file documenting all of this (see the attached article from the Blade).

It is our contention that unless there is communality in use and operations, as originally intended with the granting of the special use as a Masonic Complex, approval should not be granted.

The Theater, Great Hall, and our grounds, have under gone a \$1.8 million dollar renovation to ensure that this important regional entertainment venue continues to play a critical role in our quality of life.

Because of the decades of operation as the Masonic Complex the community does not discern that there is an nonrelated use taking place within the campus, and holds us responsible and accountable, for all that happens or takes place. The public's perception, and belief, that this a safe environment can never be compromised or we will cease to exist.

Janitor arrested for after-hours party at Toledo charter school

An intoxicated janitor was arrested during an after-hours party at a charter school in South Toledo, authorities said.

Officers responded to a reported fight about 3:48 a.m. Sunday at the Academy of Educational Excellence, 4747 Heatherdowns Blvd. They found multiple broken bottles and blood inside the building. The school's janitor, Devon Loggins, 28, was passed out on the floor, police said.

At least four people said they were hurt in the fight and were taken to the University of Toledo Medical Center, the former Medical College of Ohio. Police cited 10 partygoers, ranging in age from 14 to 23, mostly on criminal trespassing or unruliness charges.

Mr. Loggins of the 900 block of Vinton Street pleaded no contest Tuesday in Toledo Municipal Court to an amended charge of disorderly conduct. Judge Robert Christiansen sentenced him to a suspended fine.

Superintendent Ann Harris told police he was supposed to clean and then leave the building. Ms. Harris is the grandmother of Mr. Loggins.

Bill Harris, school board president and husband of Ms. Harris, said today the party did not affect school operations. It occurred on the second floor, and classes are held on the first.

Mr. Harris said the board will review whether to fire Mr. Loggins. Board member have not yet reviewed a police report.

"We're certainly saddened and disappointed," he said.

The school enrolls 82 students from kindergarten through fourth grade.

STAFF ANALYSIS

The applicant is requesting a Special Use Permit for a new school at 4747 Heatherdowns Boulevard. The ±11.7-acre site is zoned RS12 Single-Dwelling Residential and occupied by an existing building, roughly 27,000 square feet. In recent years the building was occupied by a School, but previously operated as an assembly hall. Surrounding land uses include open green space and a funeral home to the north across Heatherdowns Boulevard, the Stranahan Theater to the east, the Ohio Turnpike to the south, and single family homes to the west across Cass Road.

The applicant, STAR Academy of Toledo, intends to operate a public community school out of the existing building on site. The school will teach grades K-8 with an enrollment of 200 kids at full capacity. The school will also employ 21 employees while operating 170 school days a year from 8:00AM-4:00PM, with tutoring until 6:00PM. A Special Use Permit is required for all schools in the City of Toledo.

Parking and Circulation

As listed in TMC§1107.0304 Parking, Loading, and Access – Schedule A, an Elementary and Middle School is required to have one (1) parking space per faculty member plus (1) parking space per three (3) staff members plus one (1) parking space per fifty (50) students for drop-off and pick-up area. Additionally, one (1) bicycle space per three (3) students plus one (1) bicycle space per ten (10) parking space for faculty and staff. The site plan and letter of intent submitted indicates there will be seventeen (17) faculty members, four (4) staff members and 200 students.

Calculations conclude that a total of twenty-three (23) parking spaces are required with one (1) van-accessible parking space for physically disabled persons.

The site plan submitted depicts a total of 159 parking spaces with six (6) spaces designated for persons with disabilities and fifty (50) bicycle spaces, the maximum required. While the available parking provided is in excess of the maximum allowable parking spaces, 150% of the minimum parking requirement, an alternative parking plan will not be required because the parking is existing on site. Additionally, a shared parking/cross-access agreement shall be established and maintained with the property to the north in order to access the facility from Cass Road and Heathedowns Boulevard. In the event the cross-access is altered in any way, a re-review of the Special Use Permit shall occur and listed as a condition of approval.

Per TMC§1107.1905 – Appearance, the materials used in the design of paving, lighting fixtures, retaining walls, fences, curbs and benches must be of good appearance, easily maintained, and indicative of their function. Additionally, as stated in TMC§1107.1909 – Maintenance, parking lots must be maintained in a safe operating condition so as not to create a hazard or nuisance. The applicant shall maintain the parking lot and driveway access from Cass Road in order to comply with the Design Standards of 1107.1900 and is listed as a condition of approval.

Landscaping

The site was developed before the 2004 zoning code and therefore not required to completely comply with the landscape standards of the 2004 code. However, TMC§1114.0500 Appearance Upgrade for Nonconforming Development, requires futures changes to bring a site closer into compliance with the 2004 code. A thirty-foot (30') frontage greenbelt is required along Cass Road and shall include at least one (1) tree for every thirty-foot (30') of lot frontage located outside the right-of-way. A total of twenty (20) trees shall be required along Cass Road. Foundation plantings shall be provided along each street facing building elevation and at all major entrances. Additionally, the terminal islands in the parking lot shall be landscaped and maintained in conformance with the Parking Lot Landscaping regulations of TMC§1108.0204.

The site plan submitted depicts a landscaping area thirty-foot (30°) wide but does not depict any plantings in the greenbelt, terminal islands or around the foundation of the building. A Landscaping Plan shall be submitted depicting the frontage greenbelt, foundation plantings and landscaped terminal and listed as conditions of approval.

Toledo 20/20 Comprehensive Plan

The Toledo 20/20 Comprehensive Plan designates this property for Institutional Campus land uses. The Institutional Campus future land use designation is intended to accommodate large institutional uses in campus-like settings. Examples such as hospitals, schools and colleges are considered Institutional Campus land uses. The IC District is intended to promote and enhance the development and expansion of medical, educational and other institutional uses. The proposed school conforms to the future land use designation targeted in the 20/20 Comprehensive Plan.

Staff recommends approval of the Special Use Permit for this location because it is compatible with the established land uses along Heatherdowns Boulevard. Additionally, the site

conforms to all applicable provisions of the Zoning Code. Finally, the proposed use meets the purpose of the Zoning Code as outlined in TMC§1101.0400.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

The staff recommends that the Toledo City Plan Commission recommend approval of SUP-4008-19, a Special Use Permit for a new school at 4747 Heatherdowns Boulevard, to Toledo City Council for the following three (3) reasons:

- The proposed use meets the stated purpose of the Zoning Code (TMC§1111.0706(A) - Review & Decision Making Criteria).
- The proposed use complies with all applicable provisions of the Zoning Code (TMC§1111.0706(B) - Review & Decision-Making Criteria); and
- 3. The request is compatible with adjacent uses in terms of scale, site design, and operating characteristics (hours of operation, traffic generation, lighting, noise, odor, dust, and other impacts associated with the use's operation) (TMC§1111.0706(C) Review & Decision-Making Criteria).

The staff further recommends that the Toledo City Plan Commission recommend approval of SUP-4008-19, a Special Use Permit for a new school at 4747 Heatherdowns Boulevard, to the Toledo City Council subject to the following forty (40) conditions:
