NACWA – National Association of Clean Water Agencies

NACWA was established in 1970 by a group of individuals representing 22 large municipal sewerage agencies. They came together to secure federal funding for municipal wastewater treatment and discuss emerging national interest in improving the quality of the nation's waters. Based upon the shared goal of effectively representing the interests and priorities of publicly-owned treatment works (POTWs), they formed NACWA - the National Association of Clean Water Agencies.

NACWA provides:

- NACWA is a clean water advocate and provides up to date clean water information to the membership.
- They are an advocacy alert group that will alert all membership on upcoming issues and they are proactive in addressing issues.
- They provide a pipeline for information in regulatory and legislative updates that would otherwise go undetected.
- They assist in legal issues and are a great legal resources, which includes a consent decree library to assist in future legal issues.
