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Opening Golf Courses Amidst the Pandemic

Davey's request to reopen the City of Toledo's municipal golf courses with stringent sanitization and social distancing guidelines was granted on April 6, 2020. As part of this request, Davey proposed a "Park and Play" program that included a list of measures to allow the golf courses to continue operations during the pandemic.

The intent of the Park and Play program is to provide confidence to golfers that they can drive to your course, park their cars, get to and around the course, and back to the parking lot in as safe an environment as possible. Because the golf functions primarily outside, proper precautions can be reasonably made to greatly reduce the chances of encountering other individuals.

Listed below are measures that were implemented as part of the Park and Play program:

- Encourage golfers to pay in advance over the phone with a credit card, show up to a pre-positioned sanitized cart, and proceed to the first tee without personal contact.
- Place appropriate signage outside the pro-shop and clubhouse entries briefly outlining the social distancing guidelines in place.
- Place appropriate signage on carts and around the clubhouse with the phone number to call-in food orders with an explanation that credit card transactions are requested.
- Eliminate sit-down food and beverage services. Use "call-ahead," "take-out, and/or "to-go" services only. Consider delivery as an option from the beverage cart, or an additional golf cart if feasible.
- Provide protective gloves to all staff handling cash or credit cards during all transactions.
- Increased tee time intervals to spread players out on the course.
- Direct players to leave the pin in the cup at all times. Raise the cup up an inch above the green surface and count it when the ball hits it. This is a good time for "gimmies."
- Follow all guidance to not exceed gathering limits established by local and state authorities.
- Remove ball washing stations or place out of usable areas.
- Remove rakes from the course and temporarily play these areas as non-hazards. Put a local rule in place that permits placing your golf ball in any bunker on the course.
- Remove all water stations from the course and either provide bottled water or advise them to purchase beverages prior to tee off
- Remove bulk scorecard, pencil and tee holders from starter areas. Only issue when requested.
- Ask customers to personally dispose of any trash they may have in the nearby receptacles.
- After play, ask golfers to go directly to their carts and park them in designated areas.








Weather and Golf

Prior to concerns over COVID-19, several days with unseasonable temperatures allowed Ottawa Park to open for play early in the year in the months of January and February where modest rounds and revenue were realized. The three courses fully opened with less playing restrictions in May and June. Weather and golf can be a double edge sword, rainfall and threat of rain deters golfers from playing while too little rain causes increased costs to properly irrigate the golf course, leading to a perceived decline in course conditions, which negatively affects play. Ideal golf conditions keep the low temperatures high and the high temperatures reasonable as days when temperatures are too hot also contribute to a decline in golf played. The data and tables below are sourced from Weather Trends International and compare realized rainfall to historical averages.

Below average rainfall was experienced throughout the majority of the year, aiding in desirable golfing conditions and rounds played.

Marketing

Marketing efforts have largely been combined to include promotion of each of the three municipal golf courses.

Savings have been realized from the budgeted marketing expense line item as the majority of marketing efforts have been conducted with in-house grass roots efforts such as email campaigns and social media posts.

Radio

A local radio ad campaign was conducted across the airwaves this Summer. The City of Toledo golf courses were featured a total of 280 times in 0:30 second spots on three radio stations (93.5, 94.5 & 106.5) throughout the months of May and June.

<u>93.5 WRQN</u>: one of the biggest listening audiences (77,600 listeners per week), this audience has *high disposable income*, making it more likely they'll be able to afford to golf which can sometimes be costly. This audience is *very strong in the 40-60 year old demographic*.

<u>106.5 ESPN Radio "The Ticket"</u> – (22,900 listeners per week) obviously, these are sports fans. This audience also has very high disposable income and is also very strong in the Male demographic. See page 8 of "The Ticket Media Kit" for more descriptive about the audience. These listeners are definitely within the profile of a golfer.

Social Media

Ottawa Park's Facebook page is growing in popularity on January 31, 2020 Ottawa Park had 134 Facebook followers. As of December 31, 2020 Ottawa Park's page had 397 followers. Regular social media posts will continue to keep customers informed and engaged.

Email

The combined customer database includes 2,967 unique emails. This figure is up 210 emails from July 1, 2020. The collection of emails is driven by the efforts of our clubhouse managers and staff upon check in. Of these 2,967 email addresses 2,278 persons are considered "engaged" meaning that they have opened and/or booked a round as a result of the email advertisement over the past 30 days. The number of engaged customers has increased significantly from July 1, 2020 when 1,236 customers were classified as engaged.

Throughout the year a total of sixty-two (62) email marketing campaigns were sent on behalf of Toledo Municipal Golf Courses. An example of Ottawa's recent e-blast sent to engaged customers promoting the Solheim Cup and analytics is depicted below.

Loyal Tee Club

A new Loyal Tee program was introduced at the Toledo Golf Show in 2020. The Loyal Tee Club is designed to attract repeat customers at Toledo's municipal golf courses. Golfers pay a one-time fee (\$49.95 non-senior/\$29.95 senior) to gain preferred player status and receive special pricing on golf rates throughout the 2020 golfing season.

Through the end of 2020 a total of 120 golfers joined the LoyalTee Club resulting in \$3,790 of membership revenue.

This is up from July 1, 2020 when 108 golfers joined the LoyalTee Club resulting in \$3,429 of membership revenue.

While we are proud of the positive response from golfers for this program we feel there is potential for golfer participation to grow in years to come.

Revenue

Ottawa Park remained open throughout the winter allowing play during days where the weather was conducive and generated modest revenues in the months of January and February.

On Thursday, March 19th the course was temporarily closed as a precaution against the pandemic.

The golf course reopened to Ohio residents for walking only on Friday, April 10th.

Beginning on Sunday, May 3rd, residency and cart restrictions were eased as we began to welcome out of state golfers and allowed the use of golf carts with a single passenger.

Golf Leagues began playing in mid to late May and continued throughout the season.



Financial Impact of Pandemic

The world-wide pandemic significantly impacted revenue figures across all industries. As a precaution, the golf course was closed for a total of twenty-two (22) days spanning the months of March and April. While it is impossible to learn the exact financial impact of course closure some assumptions can be made to identify a reasonable revenue loss figure. We will highlight three (3) areas in which the golf courses experienced revenue loss. 1. Days closed 2. Days with residency and cart restrictions 3. Days without F&B service

1. Days Closed—Thirteen (13) of the days in which Ottawa Park was closed occurred in March. Dividing planned revenue equally in each day of March assumes daily revenue in March to be \$766. If we are to assume achieving daily revenue goals, revenue loss due to the pandemic would be \$9,958 in March. (13 days * \$766 average expected daily revenue = \$9,958 revenue lost)

If this same rational was extended into the month of April, we would expect \$2,487 in daily revenue as outlined by the submitted and approved golf budget. Multiply the anticipated daily revenue in April by the nine (9) days in which the course was closed, we can attribute an additional \$22,383 in revenue loss due to the pandemic. (9 days * \$2,487 expected daily revenue = \$22,383).

2. **Open With Restrictions**—During the twenty-three day time frame from April 10th through May 3rd, in which precautionary restrictions were placed on golf operations, we realized an average daily revenue of \$650. In the two week period after residency and cart restrictions were relaxed (May 3rd—May 16th), daily revenue jumped to an average of \$2,847.

Assuming that revenues would be similar to the fourteen day period following the loosening of restrictions, we can attribute an additional \$50,531 in potential revenue loss due to the pandemic during the period from April 10th through May 3rd.

\$2,847 average daily revenue May 3—May 16

(less) \$650 average daily revenue April 10—May 2

\$2,197 average daily difference in revenue (multiplied by) 23 days, total potential revenue loss \$50,531.

3. **Days Without F&B**—As a further precaution against COVID-19 food and beverage operations did not resume until May 20th. For the purpose of this exercise, we will examine potential revenue loss in F&B from the dates April 10th through May 19th.

Food and Beverage revenue generated \$12,095.42 from May 20th through June 30th. There were 6,562 rounds played during the same time period resulting in an average of \$1.84 of F&B revenue per round of golf.

A total of 3,365 rounds of golf were played from reopening on April 10th to when F&B operations began on May 20th. If we assume the same amount of F&B revenue generated per round, we can attribute an additional \$6,202.54 in lost revenue due to the pandemic.

Potential Revenue Loss Summary

\$9,958 - 13 days in closed in March

\$22,383-9 days closed in April

\$50,531—23 days open with restrictions

\$6,202—Lack of F&B operations

\$89,074—Total potential revenue loss due to pandemic.





Weekly Golf Leagues

Offseason sales efforts to acquire leagues at Ottawa were also effective. Ottawa Park reported having twenty-two (22) leagues contributing an estimated \$124,332.00 of annual green fee and cart revenue at the January 29th stakeholder meeting. Heading into March, Ottawa had acquired two new leagues increasing anticipated green fee and cart revenue by \$7,896.00.

As a result of pandemic influences, two leagues canceled at Ottawa Park for the 2020 season. These leagues represented 40 players contributing annual revenues of \$14,960.00. Several leagues delayed their league schedule and additional revenue was not realized as a result. The current combined realized lost revenue is \$19,776.00. Details on how each golf league impacted golf revenues is detailed below.

Course Conditions

Ottawa Park Golf Course continues to show improvement with regards to conditions of the golf course. Investment in mowing equipment has yielded the desired returns and results. Pictures depicting course conditions are on pages to follow.

Grass height was properly maintained throughout all areas of the golf course throughout the season. Many compliments were made by appreciative golfers praising efforts made to keep the rough height down and greens smooth.

Aerification and overseeding was performed on greens, tees and fairways at Ottawa Park Golf Course for the first time in several years. Aerification and overseeding are routine cultural practices that should be performed annually to maintain turf and soil health.

We continue to experience flooding on holes 2, 3, 17 & 18. Best efforts are continually made to remove standing water from these areas during periods of heavy rainfall. We have also limited access by roping off these areas in attempt to regrow lost turf.

The biggest concern at Ottawa Park in relation to course conditions and sustainable operations has to do with the pump station. The pump station is in need of several new components including the Clay-Valve. The Clay-Valve regulates water flow throughout the system and when this component is not functioning as designed, it may lead to a shorter lifespan of the entire irrigation system. Due to the condition of the Clay-Valve, the entire irrigation system must be completely shut down everyday when not in use. When the system is turned back on it needs to completely repressure causing extreme fatigue and undue stress on the pipes and other components. The persistent leaking of the Clay-Valve also means that the pump is always running full throttle. Continuing to operate the system in this manner will likely lead to further system failures.

Davey Value Added Items

A major concern at Ottawa Park Golf Course is the pruning and removal of hazardous trees. On June 10, 2020 a large tree limb fell onto the bridge near hole 18. This bridge is a high traffic area for golfers and staff. Hazard trees present an ever-present risk and pose a liability to all interested parties. A full hazard tree assessment has been completed by Davey Tree in July and the City's Forestry Department has a plan in place to address the hazard trees.


The Davey Resource Group performed Geographical Information System (GIS) drone mapping of the entire property at no additional charge to the City. The GIS mapping of the golf course assists in locating subsurface features, assessment of vegetation health, and assessment of storm water runoff. This graphical information was used to generate website enhancement which includes an overview story map. Moving forward, we will explore advertising options and event sponsorship utilizing this interactive digital media feature.











Revenue

Detwiler Park outperformed initial revenue projections throughout the season despite opening for play later than anticipated on April 10th. Improved and consistent playing conditions during the first half of the season increased consumer confidence much faster than anticipated. The strong financial performance at Detwiler Park reinforces the narrative that demand for a championship caliber golf course layout is strong within the Toledo community. Due to limitations with the current irrigation system combined with below average rainfall, tees and fairways began to experience heat stress and thinning turf in the second half of the season. Rounds played at Detwiler decreased from early season trends in periods of the second half of the season due to thinning turf on tees and fairways. Irrigation system limitations combined with below average seasonal rainfall were main factors leading to thinning turf on these areas of the golf course.

Much like Ottawa Park, Detwiler had temporary residency and cart restrictions in place from April 10th through May 3rd. In the month of April, Ohio residents were able to play a round of golf without the use of a power golf car. Golfers from out of state were welcomed and permitted to rent a golf cart with a single passenger beginning in early May. Golf leagues began play in May and continued throughout the rest of the season.



Financial Impact of Pandemic

The world-wide pandemic significantly impacted revenue figures across all industries. As a precaution, Detwiler Park Golf Course did not open for play until April 10th. While it is impossible to learn the exact financial impact of course closure some assumptions can be made to identify a reasonable revenue loss figure. We will highlight three (3) areas in which the golf courses experienced revenue loss. 1. Days closed 2. Days with residency and cart restrictions 3. Days without F&B service

- 1. Days Closed—During the months of May and June when the course was open without restrictions, Detwiler Park Golf Course significantly outperformed initial revenue projections realizing roughly 150% of revenue goals. Detwiler Park had a revenue goal of \$12,400 for the month of March. It is reasonable to assume that had Detwiler been open for play during the month of March, the revenue goal would have been achieved. Due to these trends, we conservatively estimate that the revenue target would have been achieved at Detwiler and attribute \$12,400 in monthly revenue lost due to the pandemic.
- 2. **Open With Restrictions**—As previously mentioned, Detwiler Park opened for play on April 10th. Throughout the month of April Ohio residents were able to visit Detwiler park to play golf but were limited to walking only. Detwiler Park is a significantly longer course than Ottawa and more spread out advancing hole to hole. The nature of the layout at Detwiler promotes the use of a power cart as it is perceived to be a less desirable course to walk than the shorter Ottawa Park. During the month of April, in which precautionary restrictions were placed on golf operations, we realized an average daily revenue of \$360. In the two week period after residency and cart restrictions were relaxed, daily revenue jumped to an average of \$3,555 in the beginning weeks of May. This average daily revenue figure is slightly higher than the average daily revenue of \$3,400 when the sample size is increased to 61 days from May 1— June 30.

For the sake of this discussion, we will apply a much more conservative average daily revenue figure of \$1,700 in April. This amount was generated by reducing the average daily revenue realized in May and June by 50%. Given this assumption, we can attribute an additional \$51,000 in potential revenue loss due to the pandemic during the month of April. (30 days * \$1,700 = \$51,000)

3. **Days Without F&B**—As a further precaution against COVID-19 food and beverage operations did not resume until May 20th. For the purpose of this exercise, we will examine potential revenue loss in F&B from the dates April 10th through May 19th.

Food and Beverage revenue generated \$18,761.73 from May 20th through June 30th. There were 5,532 rounds played during the same time period resulting in an average of \$3.39 of F&B revenue per round of golf.

A total of 1,783 rounds of golf were played from reopening on April 10th to when F&B operations began on May 20th. If we assume the same amount of F&B revenue generated per round, we can attribute an additional \$6,047.03 in lost revenue due to the pandemic.

Potential Revenue Loss Summary

\$12,400 - Closed in March

\$51,000—Open with restrictions

\$6,047—Lack of F&B operations

\$69,447—Total potential revenue loss due to pandemic.





Leagues

The demand for a championship caliber golf course is also evidenced by the increase in the number of leagues Detwiler Park hosts compared to the amount in 2019. Off season sales efforts of league acquisition proved effective. At the Toledo Stakeholder meeting held on January 29, 2020 we reported having eleven (11) individual weekly leagues at Detwiler Park with estimated annual league revenues of \$68,056. Heading into March 2020 we had increased the number of leagues to seventeen (17) with estimated annual league revenues of \$111,744.00.

Due to various concerns or conditions sprouting from the pandemic, a total of four (4) scheduled leagues canceled for the season. League participation was reduced in another three (3) golf leagues contributing to additional potential revenue loss. Updated revenue projections resulting from the sale of green fees and cart rental from golf leagues is now just shy of \$79,000.

Course Conditions

Detwiler Park Golf Course continues to show improvement with regards to conditions of the golf course. Investment in mowing equipment has yielded the desired returns and results. New wooden trash receptacles were built and installed by the grounds crew and new tee signs were installed manufactured by the City's Transportation Division.

Aerification and overseeding was performed on greens, tees and fairways at Detwiler Park Golf Course for the first time in several years. Aerification and overseeding are routine cultural practices that should be performed annually to maintain turf and soil health.

The irrigation system at Detwiler Park continues to be our biggest challenge. Upon priming the system for Spring startup, the intake was discovered to have more sediment buildup that created an inability for water to run through the system. Solomon Diving was contracted again this year to remove sediment buildup around the intake that is submerged in the irrigation pond. Solomon Diving reported that the issue of sediment buildup is likely to persist and this practice will have to continually be performed. It was recommended that a more comprehensive dredging of the irrigation pond be performed. Minor repairs have been conducted to electrical systems at the pump house and the 50Hp motor powering the pump has been replaced. The 50 Hp pump had broken down beyond repair and is a vital component to the irrigation system functionality. Without replacement of that motor the irrigation system would have ceased to function and turf would have been lost. Several irrigation heads and numerous other irrigation components were repaired and replaced throughout the first half of 2020.

The irrigation infrastructure at Detwiler Park is original to when the course was built in 1968. Given the current condition of the irrigation system, Detwiler Park is at risk of a catastrophic failure which is likely to threaten the future viability of operations should investment in irrigation infrastructure not be made.

Davey Value Added Items

The Davey Institute performed an irrigation assessment and report recommending a phased plan of action to address Detwiler's irrigation system concerns over time. The proposed project is currently being evaluated as plans progress toward achieving a fiscally responsible solution to Detwiler Park's infrastructure needs.





Revenue

Collins Park first opened for play on April 10th with the same residency and cart restrictions that governed Ottawa and Detwiler Park Golf Courses. Revenue was generated on just eight (8) of the twenty-one (21) days in month of April Collins Park was open for play. Revenue became steady and began to normalize during the month of May when residency and cart restrictions were relaxed.

Financial Impact of Pandemic

The world-wide pandemic significantly impacted revenue figures across all industries. As a precaution, Collins Park Golf Course did not open for play until April 10th. While it is impossible to learn the exact financial impact of course closure, some assumptions can be made to identify a reasonable revenue loss figure. We will highlight three (3) areas in which the golf courses experienced revenue loss. 1. Days closed 2. Days with residency and cart restrictions 3. Days without F&B service

- 1. Days Closed— Collins Park was scheduled to open for play on April 1st so the impact of a delayed start was not as significant at this facility. If it is assumed that revenue goals would have otherwise been achieved during this time frame we can attribute \$1,620.00 of potential revenue loss. This figure was generated by average daily expected revenue of \$180.00 based off of preseason projections multiplied by the number of days closed.
- 2. Open With Restrictions— Throughout the remainder of April, Ohio residents were able to visit Collins park to play golf but were limited to walking only. These restrictions were lifted in early in May.
 - Revenue was generated on just eight (8) of the twenty-one (21) days in month of April Collins Park was open for play with the aforementioned restrictions. Due to the small sample size of days where revenue was generated in April of 2020 it is unreasonable to utilize that actual data from those days in forming assumptions regarding the impact of potential revenue loss. Instead the assumption will be made that revenue targets would have been achieved and attribute an additional \$3,780.00 of potential revenue loss for the days in April Collins Park was open with restrictions. (21 days * \$180 average daily revenue).
- 3. **Days Without F&B**—As a further precaution against COVID-19 food and beverage operations did not resume until May 20th. For the purpose of this exercise, we will examine potential revenue loss in F&B from the dates April 10th through May 19th.
 - Food and Beverage revenue generated \$4,285.71 from May 20th through June 30th. There were 1,085 rounds played during the same time period resulting in an average of \$3.95 of F&B revenue per round of golf.

A total of 407 rounds of golf were played from reopening on April 10th to when F&B operations began on May 20th. If we assume the same amount of F&B revenue generated per round, we can attribute an additional \$1,607.64 in lost revenue due to the pandemic.

Potential Revenue Loss Summary

\$1,620—Closed in April

\$3,780—Open with restrictions

\$1,607—Lack of F&B operations

\$7,007—Total potential revenue loss due to pandemic.





Course Conditions

Collins Park Golf Course continues to show improvement with regards to conditions of the golf course. New tee signs were manufactured by the City's Transportation Division and installed by the grounds crew. A new water filter was installed at the maintenance building to aid in water quality as debris was leaching into the irrigation system causing damage to sprinkler heads.

Aerification was performed on greens, tees and fairways at Collins Park Golf Course for the first time in many years. Greens were also overseeded at Collins Park. Aerification and overseeding are routine cultural practices that should be performed annually to maintain turf and soil health.

Davey Value Added

In attempt to improve turf health on the greens, Davey donated 30 gallons of Holganix, an organic plant probiotic designed to charge the soil with diverse microbes to improve playability, resilience and promote soil health. The 30 gallons of this product is sufficient amount to apply the product at an interval of 10-14 days on each green at Collins Park and has a value of \$15,000.


Davey also delivered a second rough mower, (2016 Jacobsen AR-522) to Collins Park in early May. Davey loaned this unit to Collins Park free of charge as the maintenance crew was having difficulty keeping up with the rapid Spring growth with the units that were on site. This Davey mower will remain at Collins Park for use for the foreseeable future.






