1. <u>Brief Description of the Project.</u>

The mountain bike trail in Ottawa-Jermain Park has always been maintained by volunteers in the Toledo Free Ride group with no funds made available by the City or any other entity. Recently a newly established volunteer group within the Toledo Free Ride group more directly involved in the concerns for the trail was started and has conducted several work day sessions to solve existing problems on the trail. This volunteer group is directly connected with the Park Commissioner.

Funds directed from the District Improvement Program awarded to the Friends of Ottawa-Jermain Park would be used to assist this volunteer group to be able to build bridges, boardwalk style features, and other fun features to both eliminate the wet/muddy sections of the trail and to provide more interesting sections of the trail for both beginner and more advanced riders.

The project would require purchasing prefabricated ramps, bridges, and other features or purchasing building materials such as wood for the bridges, etc and steel pipes or beams to stabilize the features described herein.

The goals and objectives of the proposed project would be to improve the riding experience for riders and to eliminate the dangers of riding in wet/muddy trails where a rider may lose control of the bike, which can occur at any speed.

Installing prefabricated ramps, etc. or building bridges or boardwalk style trail sections at the worst sections susceptible to wet/muddy conditions will protect riders and hikers (who are allowed on the trail) and provide a safer and more enjoyable experience.

This is the only official mountain bike trail in Toledo and will benefit the local community of riders and hikers more than the Metroparks trail at Oak Openings, which is in the far west section of Lucas County in Swanton, Ohio

3. <u>Project Location</u> – Describe in detail the location of the proposed project. Is this project in an area already targeted by the city of Toledo or any other state of federal agency for funding?

This project is located in previously unused wooded areas in Ottawa-Jermain Park and is 6.5 miles of "Single Track" trail built primarily by and for mountain bikers.

This area has never been targeted by the city or any other entity for funding.

This trail has been created entirely by volunteer hours using hand tools such as loppers, shovels, and saws.


The volunteer group currently consists of more than 25 concerned riders and families and has been active in maintaining and fixing problem areas of the trail by rerouting problem areas, weed wacking, limb trimming, downed tree removals. The group gets notifications of work days through the "Toledo Free Ride" facebook page, the Toledo Area Mountain Bike Association website (toledomtb.org) and by the Project Contact Personnel identified above on the front page of this application. Future attempts will be made to secure additional funding as this new volunteer group becomes more cohesive. Fund-raising events and community donations would be possible solutions. Volunteers have donated over 80 hours since the Toledo Area Mountain Bike Association started keeping track in November 2020.

The Friends of Ottawa-Jermain Park is a 501c-3 entity that is organized to promote improvements to Ottawa-Jermain Park. It receives no funding from the City, but only from grants and donations from the community. The "Toledo Free Ride" group was organized by several individuals around 2010 to promote the activity of mountain biking in the Toledo area. The organization obtained permission from the City to build a trail to be used primarily by bikers, but allowing hikers. The land that was allowed by the City was unused wooded areas in both Ottawa and Jermain Parks. The trail utilized what varied terrain that was available to provide hill climbs, switchbacks, downhills and some obstacles. The trail was designed to have shortcuts for abbreviated rides for beginners and had proper directional signage. There is a full map of the trail layout at the trailhead in Jermain Park. Currently, there are over 1000 users of the facebook page to identify rides, work days, and report problems. The trail was built in several iterations beginning solely in Jermain Park and then expanding to the far west area of Ottawa Park. The trail only crosses one small public access road in the entire length of the trail utilizing underpasses in other areas.

The Friends of Ottawa-Jermain Park has a structured board consisting of: Beth Estep, President; Mlchael Murnen, Treasurer; Michael Bowman, Vice President; Gino Torio, Secretary. The "Toledo Free Ride" group is an ad hoc group with several individuals organizing events, etc. as described above. All significant events or changes to the trail do require approval of the Park Commissioner who to this point is very favorable to this volunteer group and its goals for the trail (see Attachment 6). The Primary Contacts as listed above do most of the coordination of work events and both are currently members of the Ottawa-Jermain Park Advisory Board and the Friends of Ottawa-Jermain Park Board and interface with the boards and the Commissioner.

This attachment lists the requested funds to either purchase the required materials to build and install features on the Ottawa-Jermain Park mountain bike trail and/or to purchase prefabricated wooden features from a well-known manufacturer. The amounts are listed per individual feature. Estimated number of features to be built is 10. See page 2 of 2 for spreadsheet calculation for cost breakdowns.

Part 1: Features to be built by volunteers:

Materials listed below are to construct (1) 12' long flat bridge 2' wide using 4x4x12' stringers to support the 2"x12" wide by 2' long decking lumber (to be cut from the 12' long 2x12 lumber) Estimated features to be built = 10

- A. Materials to build one feature: costs from local Lowes website on July 12, 2021
 - 1. (3) 4x4x12' #2 Pressure Treated Lumber @ \$16.98 ea.
 - 2. (2) 2x12x12' #2 Pressure Treated Lumber @ \$40.98.ea.
 - 3. (1) box Power Pro wood Screws 10 x 3 ½" @ \$11
 - 4. Total cost per (1) feature = 3x\$16.98 + 2x\$40.98 + 1x\$11 = \$143.90
 - 5. Total cost for (10) features = $10x$143.90 = 1439.00×1.0725 (Sales tax)= \$1546.93
 - 6. Estimated delivery fee..\$75 (1 Truck)

B. Tools required to construct above feature:

- 1. (1) Dewalt 20 volt max. Cordless Impact Driver 1/4' Variable Speed @ \$150
- 2. (1) Dewalt 20 volt max. 6 ½' Cordless Circular Saw @ \$130
- 3. (1) Craftsman 48" Box Beam Level @ \$30
- 4. (1) Swanson Tool Company Speed Square @ \$10

Total cost for above tools = \$150 + \$130 + \$30 + \$10 = \$320
