 - **a.** 10-20 million should be put into an endowment for the city parks, so we can pull money from the endowment each year to keep the parks up
 - **b.** Get more funding to get more youth into forums to ask them what they want
 - c. Higher pay, full-time, union protection... investing in Parks employees
 - **d.** Building to learn crafts, art, music, etc. where the old Martin Luther King School is
 - **e.** Would like to work with youth/inspire the youth by creating murals at the schools (will connect with Ignazio)
