- Ohio EPA is awarding the City a Section 319(h) Nonpoint Source Implementation Grant Total amount of additional funding is \$299,610
 - o Grant Amount is \$299,610.
 - o There is no cost share or match requirement.
- The project will create a functional floodplain bench along 1,000 linear feet of Hill Ditch, restore 0.19 acres of floodplain wetland, restore 0.80 acres of riparian buffer and create opportunities for the treatment of stormwater runoff prior to discharge to Hill Ditch.
- This funding will reduce the sediment and nutrient load of stormwater entering Hill Ditch and draining to the Ottawa River.
- The City will host public meetings to make neighboring residents aware of the project and the anticipated timeline of construction. The project will be promoted by regional partners via social media platforms and newsletters. Partners include Lucas Soil and Water Conservation District, Partners for Clean Streams, Toledo-Lucas County Rain Garden Initiative, Toledo-Lucas County Sustainability Commission, and Toledo Metropolitan Area Council of Governments.
- The grant period is September 1, 2021, to August 31, 2024.
