**Authorizing the Mayor to enter into an agreement to accept financial assistance from the National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA) in an amount not to exceed \$30,000 for an outdoor performing space at Junction Park; authorizing the deposit, appropriation and expenditure of funds for said project in the Operation Grant Fund; authorizing the Mayor to enter into contracts for said project; and declaring an emergency.**

### SUMMARY & BACKGROUND:

The Division of Parks, Recreation and Forestry created a grant proposal, which was submitted to the National Recreation and Park Association. The approved grant proposal asked for financial assistance not to exceed \$30,000 for an outdoor performing space at Junction Park. Passage of this Ordinance is required to enable the City of Toledo to accept the grant.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Toledo:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor is authorized to enter into agreements and to accept and deposit grant proceeds in an amount not to exceed \$30,000 from the National Recreation and Park Association for the purpose of an outdoor performing space at Junction Park into the Operation Grant Fund, Account Code 2016-60300-7G00181AJUNPK.

SECTION 2. That the sum of \$30,000 is appropriated from unappropriated grant proceeds in the Operation Grant Fund into Account Code as listed in Section 1 and the expenditure of same is authorized for an outdoor performing space at Junction Park.

SECTION 3. That the Mayor is authorized to accept bids and award contracts for the purpose authorized in Section 1, upon terms and conditions acceptable to the directors of Public Service and Law.

SECTION 4. That the finance director is authorized to draw warrant or warrants against the above account code in an amount not to exceed \$30,000 in payment of the above authorized obligations upon presentation of the proper voucher or vouchers.

SECTION 5. That this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall be in force and effect from and after its passage. The reason for the emergency lies in the fact that same is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and property, and for the further reason that this Ordinance must be immediately effective in order to facilitate the signing of the agreement with the National Recreation and Park Association to accept the funds so as to not delay the project.
