Authorizing the mayor to enter into and execute necessary agreements with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as granted through the Section 319 (h) Grant; authorizing the mayor to accept and deposit grant proceeds in the amount of \$299,610 into the Operation Grants Fund; authorizing the appropriation and expenditure of said grant proceeds for the Bandore Park Stream Restoration Project; authorizing the mayor to execute necessary agreements in connection with the grants; authorizing the mayor to accept bids and execute necessary contracts for the purchase of professional services and goods and services to administer the grants; and declaring an emergency.

SUMMARY & BACKGROUND:

The City of Toledo has been awarded funding and is invited to enter into a grant agreement with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for a Section 319(h) Grant in the amount of \$299,610 to be used for the Bandore Park Stream Restoration Project. This ordinance authorizes the mayor to accept, deposit, appropriate and expend up to \$299,610 in grant proceeds from the EPA.

The fiscal impact of this ordinance is as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Toledo:

SECTION 1. That the mayor is authorized to enter into a grant agreement with the Environmental Protection Agency for the Bandore Park Stream Restoration Project upon terms and conditions acceptable to the Director of Public Utilities and the Director of Law.

SECTION 2. That the mayor is authorized to accept and deposit grant proceeds from the Environmental Protection Agency in an amount not to exceed \$299,610 into the Operation Grants Fund,

SECTION 4. That the mayor is authorized to accept bids and execute necessary contracts related to this grant upon such terms and conditions as shall be approved by the Director of Public Utilities and the Director of Law.

SECTION 6. That this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency and shall be in force and effect from and after its passage. The reason for the emergency lies in the fact that this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and property of the city and for the further reason that this Ordinance must be immediately effective in order to implement this program within the Environmental Protection Agency's designated time schedule.
