Authorizing the expenditure of an amount not to exceed \$1,500,000 from the Capital Improvement Fund for Fire Station improvements; authorizing the Mayor to accept bids and award contracts for the same; and declaring an emergency.

SUMMARY & BACKGROUND:

This Ordinance authorizes the expenditure of approved Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) funds for various facility improvements and refinement projects at the Fire and Rescue Department's 22 buildings. Said improvements are primarily prioritized according to need as indicated in the Woolpert Facility Condition Assessment Portfolio Summary, attached herein as Addendum 1, and include, but are not limited to, station roofs, multiple concrete jobs, parking lot pavement, HVAC and vehicle building exhaust systems, windows, kitchen remodels, parking lot security fencing, overhead doors, office remodeling, station equipment, and station security improvements, etc.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Toledo:

SECTION 1. That an amount not to exceed \$1,500,000 is authorized for expenditure from the Capital Improvement Fund, Account Code 5040-53000-8CP2304FIRBLD, for Fire Station improvements.

SECTION 2. The Mayor is authorized to prepare plans and specifications, accept bids, and enter into contracts necessary to complete said Fire Station improvements. Said contracts shall contain such terms and conditions as the Mayor may deem requisite and proper and shall be subject to approval by the Department of Law and the Director of Fire.

SECTION 3. That the Director of Finance is authorized to draw warrant or warrants against the Account Code listed in Section 1 in an amount not to exceed \$1,500,000 in payment of the above authorized obligations upon presentation of the proper voucher or vouchers.

SECTION 4. That this Ordinance, being an emergency measure, shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage. The reason for the emergency lies in the fact that the Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of public health, safety, and welfare and for further reason that timely building improvements spare mission-critical facility infrastructure from costly emergency repairs and requisite station closures, which consequently extends emergency response times and subjects affected district citizenry to undue peril.

Vote on emergency clause: yeas 12, nays 0.
