- **Total Staffing: 593** (up from 587 end of '23)
 - Includes 10 Fire Recruits currently in the academy, graduate 2/28/25.
 - 19 are already certified EMT's and came to line operations this week.

Hiring and Retirements

- 2024 YTD - 21 Retirements/ Separations
 - Class of 30 started August 16th, 2024
 - Recruitment/testing for 2025 class open until January 17th
- 2025 Projected retirements – 38
 - Budgeted class of 20 in Fall 2025

2024 Response Data

- Total Incidents – **58,080**
 - 3.4% increase over 2023
 - Avg: 175/Day
- Fire Incidents – **9,255**
 - Working (Building) Fires: 192
- E.M.S. Incidents – **48,825**
- Total Responses through Nov 2024 - **100,407**
 - 1.8% increase over 2023
 - Avg: 302/Day

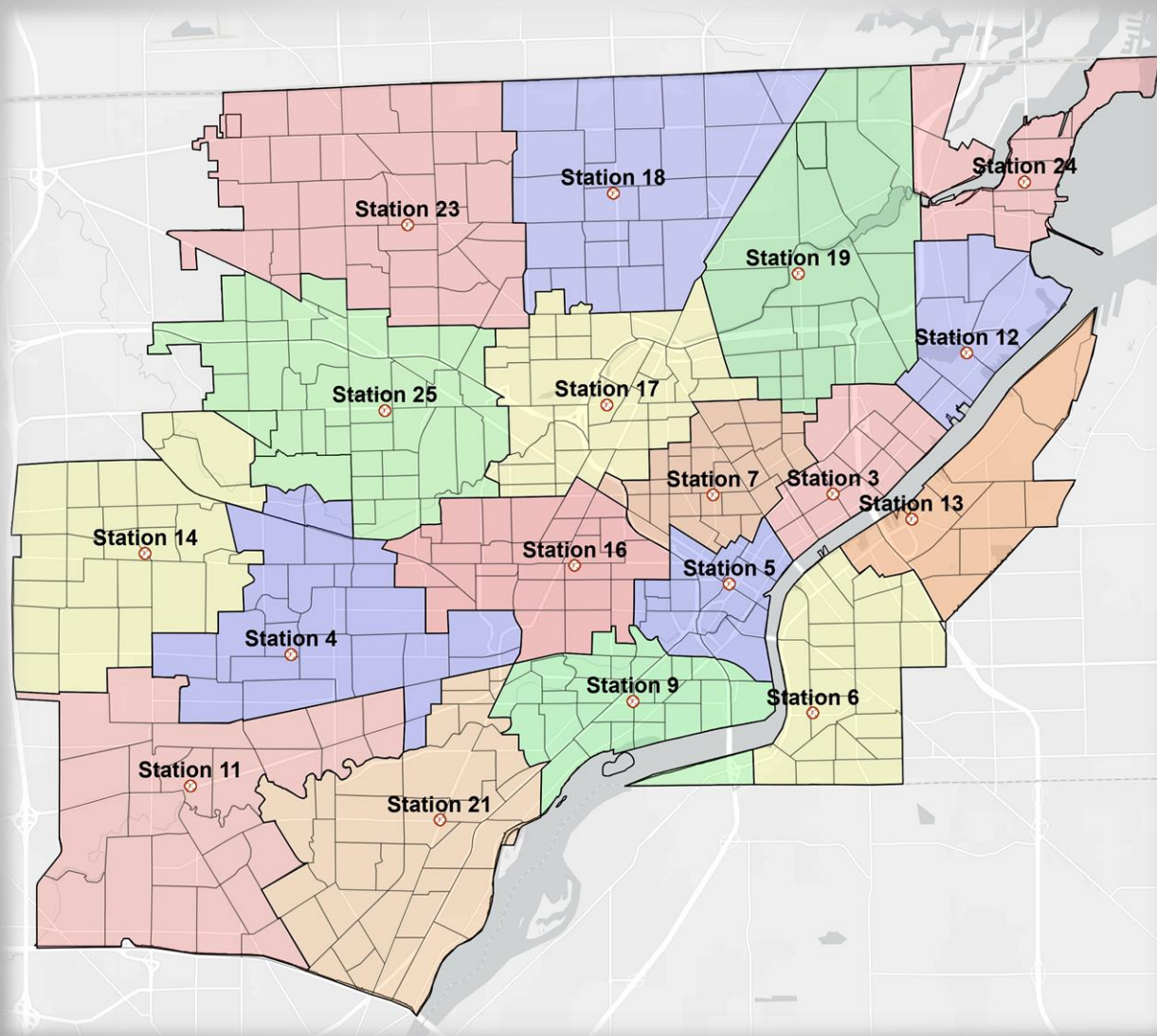

- Received Accreditation status with Commission on Fire Accreditation International for the 5th time.
- Fire Station building maintenance improvements are ongoing. Working with consultant and facilities to streamline projects.
- Hired 30 in Fire class 298, with graduation scheduled for February 28, 2025
- 2024 TFRD Grant awards YTD \$3,234,358
- Transitioned to ALS/BLS on August 5, 2024
