career connections

Career Connections is a joint initiative among the Governor's Office of Workforce Transformation, Ohio Department of Higher Education, OhioMeansJobs and Ohio Department of Education and Workforce. Career Connections began in 2012 by providing a framework by which students develop a vision and realistic plan for their futures – during K-12 and beyond. Learning strategies are embedded into Ohio's New Learning Standards for English language arts, math, science and social studies. Career Connections aligns the many efforts around college and career readiness to support students in becoming productive and engaged citizens.

Career Awareness

Elementary Grades (K-5)

Students become familiar with careers through learning that connects classroom instruction to future work. Career awareness strategies show students various types of careers and stimulate interest in future work.

Career Exploration

Middle Grades (6-8)

Students explore their career interests through embedded activities. Career exploration strategies are opportunities for students to discover work environments and understand the various aspects of the workplace. Strategies include tools and instruments that help students understand and appreciate their strengths and interests. Students start plans for their future with career information and postsecondary education data. Plans include course selection and planning as well as career aspirations and goals.

Current Initiatives

Toledo Preparatory Academy - K-8 Charter school on the east side of Toledo. The school provides opportunities for their 7th an 8th grade students to engage in career exploration opportunities in the areas of Culinary, Broadcasting, Cosmetology, and Design & Production.

- Guest speaker engagement with local professional
- Field Trips to local businesses
- *Future engagement:* Habitat for Humanity- Playhouse Project Priming

December 6th – 32 students and 4 teachers participated in guest speaker activity

December 12th – 18 students and 2 teachers engaged in a field trip to Urban Wholistics Farm. Learned about the use of crops in make personal and household items.



Discovery Academy – K-6 Charter school in Toledo. Discovery services students from all across Toledo. The teachers and administrators do an amazing job of providing project-based learning, integration of life skills into the classroom, and supporting students with a variety of academic needs.

- Provided a child-focused trauma-informed care training. A total of 52 teachers and administrators participated in the training on **December 19**th.
- Additional career awareness programming collaborations for the students will be explored this year.

Current Initiatives

Glass City Academy – This is a dropout recovery center that serves students ages 15-22. The school serves students who are at least a year behind on high school credits.

- *Primary Population:* Youth in group homes, pregnant teens, you who can't thrive in traditional schools, youth involved in the justice system, military bound youth
- *Current Activities:* Planning site visit opportunities for students; developing a CCMEP Application event; and connecting students to post-graduation job and/or education options.

Toledo Public Schools –

- Career Technical Education Program: Working with the CTE Team to explore workforce development opportunities for students in their programs. I was asked to serve as a member of their CTE Middle Grades Advisory Committee and the Entrepreneurship CTE Program Advisory Committee.
- Homeless/Foster Student Program: Facilitated exploratory discussions with the Executive Director, Community Engagement and Student Supports, Heather Baker regarding education and workforce opportunities post-high school for this students population.

- Youth Workforce Convening: In partnership with Educational Service Center of Lake Erie West, Chamber of Commerce, Junior Achievement, and others, we are planning a youth workforce programs convening.
