








The Bridge

- Barrier-separated multi-use path
- Three traffic lanes and a full width emergency lane in each direction (8 lanes total)
- Each lane measures3.75 metres/12.1 feet in width
- Accommodation for oversized vehicles




















Highway 401 in Ontario via the Rt. Hon. Herb Gray Parkway

Customer Accounts


Benefits to passenger and commercial travellers:



Community Benefits

Project Economic Contribution

Since the start of construction in 2018 through 2022, it is estimated that the project:

US:

- contributed over \$1.94 billion (CDN) to Michigan's Gross Domestic Product (GDP)
 - \$1.87 billion (CDN) contributed to local GDP in metro Detroit
- supported 12,670 jobs in Michigan with majority centered around metro Detroit.

Canada:

- contributed over \$1.39 billion (CDN) to Ontario's GDP
 - \$1.3 billion (CDN) contributed to local GDP in Windsor Metropolitan Area
- supported 10,890 jobs in Ontario with majority centered around Windsor.



The economic contribution of the project will continue to increase as the construction period concludes and the project enters its operations phase.
